

ZOGICS TURF Maintenance Guide



Maintenance Schedule

Daily: Check turf after each day's use for any topical spills, tears, or trouble spots. Remove loose debris **Weekly:** Vacuum with shop vac to remove small, loose particles. Spray disinfectant lightly and let dry (Vital Oxide).

Quarterly: Seams should be inspected and resealed if separation is occurring.

Annually: Turf fields should be groomed.

General Cleaning & Care

Remove all large and abrasive debris from training turf by hand prior to conducting cleaning procedures. Smaller nonabrasive material can be removed most easily by using a backpack blower or vacuum with synthetic fiber bristles such as nylon or polypropylene (no metal fibers).

For specific instructions on cleaning stains, see next page.

- Footwear should be restricted to 1/2" molded cleats. Turf Shoes are recommended.
- · No heavy loads exceeding 300 lbs per sq.ft.
- Stance areas face abnormal wear patterns and must be monitored regularly.
- · No vehicles of any kind should be allowed on turf.
- No food, chewing gum, sunflower seeds and/or tobacco products on playing surfaces.
- Daily cleaning of surface should be hand picked. Vacuums with dual motors and leaf blowers are recommended.
- Turf grooming and cleaning must be done by trained staff and authorized equipment.
- Steps must be taken to prevent dirt/debris from collecting onto surface from nearby trees and parking lots





Disinfecting Protocol

Use Vital Oxide for mold spots, fungus, moss, or to disinfect. Vital Oxide comes ready-to-use and is sprayer-compatible. Vital Oxide is an EPA registered disinfectant. For efficient disinfecting, we recommend using an electrostatic or atomizing sprayer. DO NOT use high pressure water spray in excess of 2500 PSI or any steam cleaning as this can severely damage the turf.

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Outdoor Use

Sweep the carpeting frequently with a broom to remove surface soil, and hose down occasionally with water. Do not use a rotary brush machine.

Indoor Use

Vacuum the grass like carpeting as you would any other type of carpeting to pick up surface soil.

Stain Removal

Grass like carpeting of Polyloom is resistant to stains. However, splits do occur, and the resulting stains should be removed as soon as possible. In most cases, they can be removed with either detergent suds or a solvent-based cleaning agent. Follow the Stain Removal Chart Below for specifics.

Note: In some cases it may be necessary to repeat any of the below procedures to ensure thorough cleaning.

Stain Removal Chart

Water-Borne & Miscellaneous Stains

Acid, Alcohol, Animal Urine, Alkali, Blood, Coffee, Tea, Cola, Soot, Chocolate, Dye, Glue, Fruit Juice, Ice Cream, Latex Paint, Milk, Mustard, Rust, Water Colors

Remedy

Sponge with detergent suds and cold water. This method will be effective even after 24 hours. **Note:** It is important to use just enough fluid to irrigate solid particles out of fabric. Too much fluid will leave a "ring." Clean from outside of stain in toward center so as not to leave a ring.

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| Persistent Stains | |
| Chewing Gum | Spray with Freon Aerosol & scrape |
| Crayon | Sponge with dry cleaning solvent |
| Nail Polish | Sponge with acetone |
| Lipstick | Sponge with dry cleaning solvent |
| Metal Polish | Sponge with dry cleaning solvent |
| Furniture Stains | Sponge with dry cleaning solvent |
| Tar | Scrape excess, sponge with dry cleaning solvent |
| Oil Paints | Blot Immediately, Sponge with turpentine or paint remover. Blot with detergent and water. Re-sponge with cold water to remove detergent. |
| Emulsified Stains Cosmetics, Ink, Shoe Polish | Sponge with detergent and cold water. Apply solvent. Clean solvent residue with soap and water. Re-sponge with cold water to remove detergent. |
